It has been owned by Norfolk Wildlife Trust since 1945. Horatio Nelson may have sailed on these very waters, but today it is probably better known for its beauty, tranquillity and wildlife.</p> <p>With the River Ant running through the middle of Barton Broad, the only way to access this fantastic reserve was by boat, until a boardwalk, funded through the Clear Water 2000 project, was built in 2003 by the Broads Authority.</p> <p>Heron's Carr Boardwalk</p> <p>This area was once open water. Over time reed and sedge began to grow, followed by trees, until the valuable carr woodland habitat you see today developed. 
